Feeding of the poor and fight against hunger

Every day an average of 1,000 children die from diarrheal diseases and malnutrition in India. Almost a third of these children are under



five years old, they are underweight and much too small for their age.

Around 800 mal- and undernourished Adivasi children and 100 malnourished mothers are supplied with milk and one egg twice a week by the milk and egg program from our partner ALMA (small congregation with almost 400 local churches) in the district of Nellore. This gives them enough protein and nutrients that are essential for their healthy development respectively for production of breast milk. The distribution is carried out in 15 different villages by many volunteers from ALMA.

Yelamma's husband works as a rickshaw driver and spends his little-earned money on alcohol and cigarettes. In order to feed herself and their children, Yelamma tried to earn money through hard work in the fields. But it was hardly doable to work all day in the field and to look after their children. Neither from her husband nor from anyone else had she got support. She and her children were taken into the milk and egg program and are now supplied daily with the essentials.

EBM INDIA Children's homes

The children's home "Compassion" in Taloulong (Manipur) is operated by the community in Manipur. Most of the accommodated children are victims of the conflicts between two tribes, the Kookies and the Nagas, who have fought against each other for years. Children were left





whose parents have died or fled to Myanmar because of the conflict. Pastor Vumthang had initially taken up with his wife some of these children in their home.

Someday, he had the vision that many more children need a good home than he can keep in his house. His congregation has shared this vision with him. Meanwhile, there is an orphanage with 50 children aged 3 to 18 years old.

The children's home has a large garden

with vegetables, fruit and a rice field. And they keep their own animals, such as pigs, ducks, geese, chickens and fish. Thus, the children get an excellent balanced diet. The children can reach the community on foot. They have their steady place and their spiritual home there. Honorary working parishioners accompany and take care for them in the so-called "study time" (homework time).

Medical Work

The "Christian Medical College" (CMC) Ludhiana is "the mother of IN-DIENHILFE", which has become "EBM INDIA" in 2008. Our commitment to India began with a collection campaign in Germany for a social fund of the hospital in northern India in 1960.



Today, the CMC Ludhiana is one of the most prestigious hospitals of India. A unique feature of the CMC Ludhiana is the rehabilitation program for physically disabled children and adolescents. In this section, the senior physician, Dr. Santhosh.

set himself the goal that children and young people whose families had come to terms with the physical disabilities of their children, get operated and learn to walk again by training and physiotherapy. Often there are children and adolescents who had suffered fractures in accidents that were not dealt with and since then, have no longer been able to walk. But there are also children and young people who were born with (treatable) disabilities or suffering from immobility caused by polio.

In the left picture you can see Kalpana Giri. She was born with crooked grown and stunted feet. In January 2013, she came to CMC Ludhiana crawling on all fours. After three surgeries and long physiotherapy she could leave the CMC in April 2014 on her own feet.
