Children's Homes

They Have Seen So Much - Just Not A Proper Home

Suffering, violence, being parentless - this is day-to-day life for many neglected street kids in India. They don't know a loving and warm home.



The "Angel Children's Home" in Akkagaripeta (South East India) is directed by one of our partner organisations called Nellore Baptist Field Association (NPBSS). They are offering a home for 44 children at the moment. Here the children can have a safe life and a chance for a dig-

nified future. They experience the loving care of the staff, they enjoy the fellowship, and they are going to school and to church regularly.

Manivarma, Subramanyam, Kumaraswamy, and Rajkumar are siblings. (Photo). Their father is an alcoholic and he's violent. At home they would neither receive food nor clothes. Their family had no money for rent. A pastor brought these four kids to the children's home. The mother received housing close by the home. They have been here for two years now. The situation has improved a lot during this time. Now they have everything they need: love, a stable home, regular meals, and a school education.

The Christian Medical Centre (CMC) in Pithapuram is a hospital which engages especially with destitute patients by offering them free medical





to leave the hospital. Due to her financial situation and her blindness the hospital waived the fees.

offering them free medical treatment. Usually they treat about 100-120 patients a day. From there they also execute eye camps: doctors, nurses, and social workers go to about 125 surrounding villages in order to examine people and to transport them to hospitals for the operations. Last year alone they were able to do about 1300 cataract surgeries free of charge.

Perumalla (28) has lost her eyesight three years ago. In addition to that she was suffering from a bleeding caused by a tumor in her uterus. She was brought into the hospital. School Education And Vocational Training

CREAM - A Campus With Perspective And Future Prospects

Besides the orphanage and the church ministry, CREAM also supports a vocational training center where young people get a one year training





in the areas of computer, electrical engineering, engine technology, and sewing.

On the same campus there is also a kindergarten for 30 poor and neglected children as well as an English Medium School (comparable to secondary level) which is designed for 100 students. They enjoy a loving environment in classes as well as one daily hot meal. CREAM supports another three sewing schools in the nearby churches which entail 45 training places. After graduating from the one year program the students receive a sewing machine as a starting capital. Students only pay one fourth of the total price.

Besides school facilities we also support talented young people by giving them scholarships. Vandana for example is originally from an orphanage from CREAM and now successfully graduated as a nurse from a hospital in Pithapuram. By now she is married and is earning her own money. REPORT 01 | 2017

What we take for granted is a high privilege for children in India. Only 2/3 of all children in primary school age actually attend a school. Our schools and training centers are often crucial for their future and whether they can shape and develop their lives independently.
